Unless you've been at Solid Rock Church for the last 8 years, it's hard to describe how far God has brought us as a church. This season of our journey began in 2008 as a church with a handful of people who were willing to take a step of faith for Jesus' sake. We asked God to give us a fresh vision for the future that would allow Solid Rock to become a flourishing beacon of hope to our community. We didn't know how it would go or how long it would take, but we were willing to trust Jesus to lead us. Our journey has taught us this crucial lesson:

In every step of faith, the Lord proves His faithfulness.

The summer of 2008 was one of the many defining moments that are a part of the Solid Rock story. Even more, we only have a story because Jesus has met us at every faith step. Jesus has repeatedly taught us that He can be trusted.

We now find ourselves at another defining moment in our journey. We're in a moment similar to Peter and his brother Andrew: "And Jesus said to them, 'Follow me, and I will make you become fishers of men.' And immediately they left their nets and followed him." (Mark 1:17-18) Jesus' intent for Peter and Andrew is the same for us – the cultivation of faith! Jesus has created a defining moment where questions have to be answered. Do we stay in control of our lives, or do we learn what it means to give Jesus control? Do we walk by

sight, or do we learn what it means to venture all on Jesus and walk by faith? Do we believe this life is all there is, or do we believe in the eternal? Like Peter and Andrew, are we willing to drop our nets and turn from everything we've previously trusted in to make life work so we can follow Jesus? Are we willing to go All In? These questions lie at the heart of this initiative.

This generosity initiative is the largest step of faith we've taken thus far as a church and we're asking you to take this step of faith with us by opening ourselves up to the Lord and learning what it truly means to go All In – not just with our generosity but with our entire lives! Solid Rock family – if we are willing to follow Jesus in this landmark moment of faith, I believe revival would erupt, not only in our church, but in our community. I'm praying for nothing less!

BIBLICAL COMMUNITY

Community Groups are the heart of our church family. We began with 4 groups in 2008. Those groups have multiplied to 13 groups throughout the Fort Worth & Aledo area, adding even more in 2017.



MISSION

We believe God has called us to be a church on mission in our everyday lives and that begins right here in our own community. This vision began to grow with the SR Christmas Store. In 2012, the Christmas Store was born as a way to partner with our local school district by helping families in need acquire gifts for their families at no expense to them, giving us a tangible way to share the love of Jesus. We have been able to serve over 90 families in our area over the last 4 years through this outreach. Starting in 2015, our Community Group ministries in partnership with the SR Mission Team have been hosting neighborhood outreaches, serving

businesses and reaching out to our community with the love of Jesus in tangible ways. In 2016, this ministry grew to include even more neighborhoods, and in 2017 we are positioning ourselves to engage in over 40 local mission outreaches.

Nationally, we spent 3 years working with a church plant in Flint, Michigan, a city known as having some of the highest poverty, drug use and prostitution in the US. While in Flint, we helped build a house in one of the highest crime and drug areas of Flint in order for this church to have one of their families live there to build relationships and share the Gospel. We also were able to restore a local food bank, build storage for a local pregnancy center, remodel a church and assist in many city outreaches such as feeding the homeless and providing water and food, door to door, to those in need. Through this endeavor, we have seen God work in amazing ways to set captives free and bring hope to a community of despair. For the last 2 years we have been working in Yukon, Oklahoma, just outside of Oklahoma City. Families from Solid Rock joined together with a local church plant in this area to minister to 2 low income housing areas and bring restoration to their community, sharing the Gospel to the families who call this area 'home.'


Part of our national efforts is to prepare to respond to natural disasters. This vision began in 2011 when wildfires swept across north Texas in the area around Possum Kingdom Lake. In the days following the fires, we sent a team with heavy equipment into the area to work with families to demo destroyed house and recover damaged property. This time of serving in the midst of tragedy opened up a new facet of our vision for national vision efforts. It's our desire to, formally, see a team emerge with the training and equipment necessary to respond to disasters across our nation for the purpose of serving those in need and share the hope we have in Jesus.

Internationally, we have spent the last 6 years working in the Philippines. Over that time, we have worked with 3 hard-to-reach villages, meeting people, praying over families, building water systems, building a church and most importantly, sharing the Gospel. In January of 2017, we sent a family from Solid Rock to live in the Philippines and raise up local leaders. Our hope is to continue our work in the Philippines along side our Family on a Mission.

ALL IN EXPLAINED: WHAT WE'RE ASKING OF THE LORD

GATHER IN WORSHIP

We've reached a critical and exciting point in life of our church family. God has graciously given us 15 acres and 2 buildings with zero debt. We consider these assets as gift of grace that Jesus has entrusted us to steward for His work and His glory. As God continues to move and grow our church, we're in need of a larger facility in order for our church family to gather in worship, while providing room to invite more people to join us. We have already expanded to 3 services to make more room and are hoping to break ground on a new facility in the Fall of 2017.

GROW TOGETHER IN COMMUNITY

Jesus calls His disciples to continually pursue spiritual growth in Gospel-centered Biblical community. By God's grace, disciples have been and are being made at Solid Rock. Our Operating Budget is the way we financially support our Biblical community. We'll continue the hard work at making disciples and nourishing the spiritual growth of our people through weekly worship gatherings, community groups and agespecific ministries.

LIVE THE MISSION

Solid Rock is committed to the work in God's Kingdom beyond our church family. As a church on mission, we'll continue to send and support local, national and international efforts to plant churches and share the life-transformational hope of the Gospel.

Locally, we will continue to be a beacon of light in our neighborhoods where we live. We will live out this mission through building intentional relationships with the people God places in our lives, serving our community and hosting events. We will also become more engaged in caring for orphans, widows and those who are in need.

Nationally, we will continue to support and encourage young churches in the US. Each spring we will send a group from Solid Rock to spend a week with a new church to help serve and support them in their local communities.

Internationally, our efforts will continue to be focused on taking the Gospel to the ends of the earth in order that all nations/ethnicities would have the opportunity to hear about Jesus. Our heart is in establishing local churches in hard to reach areas of the world through serving people groups and sharing the Gospel. During the next 24 months we will have two families living internationally among unreached people groups in China and the Philippines. Additionally, we will send groups from our church annually to encourage and help with those efforts.



Primary Goal

Our primary goal is 100% participation. We want 100% of those who call Solid Rock home to open themselves up to the Lord and allow Him to do a life-changing work as it relates to generosity.



Secondary Goal

We are trusting God for our secondary goal of \$1.5 million in generosity over the next two years to accomplish these Jesus-centered initiatives.

WEEK 1 | QUESTIONS FOR REFLECTION A CALL TO LIVE 'ALL IN'

In the opening sermon for the 'All In' series, we discussed what it truly looks like to follow Jesus all-in. In Luke 9, Jesus tells His followers that we have to be willing to die to ourselves in order to live for Him. This type of dying means surrendering selfish ambitions and desires and allowing God to replace those with His ambitions and desires for you.

A life that is 'All In' for Jesus requires loving God and others by sacrificially and generously giving of ourselves.

1. Why should you expect that God will do more through you than you think is possible?

2. Share a time where God has done far more than you ever thought or imagined.

3. Based off of Jesus' statement in Luke 9:23-25, what does it mean to have an all-in mindset?

4. How does God's love for us affect us in giving generously and sacrificially?

5. Generosity is a characteristic of God. Why do we find joy in exhibiting God's character through generosity to the world around us?

6. What is a next step of faith for you as you pursue an 'All In' life for Jesus?

WEEK 2 | QUESTIONS FOR REFLECTION A CALL TO 'ALL IN' FAITH - PART 1

On the second Sunday in the 'All In' series, we looked at the first of two sermons on what it looks like to live with 'All In' faith. We learned that living with 'All In' faith means abandoning your faith in anything other than Jesus as the only way to attain eternal life in God's Kingdom.

'All In' faith means believing that eternal life in God's Kingdom is better than anything else, compelling us to give up everything to follow Jesus.

4. Why does James say that giving generously and sacrificially is evidence of our faith in Jesus?

5. As a follower of Jesus, why should we be willing to forsake all treasures on earth for eternal life and God's Kingdom?

6. When you look at your financial commitments, what does it say about your priorities?

6. What do you feel like is holding you back from trusting God by being generous with what He has given you?

WEEK 4 | QUESTIONS FOR REFLECTION A CALL TO 'ALL IN' GENEROSITY

In the sermon this past Sunday, we learned how the grace of God fuels 'All In' generosity. When a person truly encounters the generosity of God, it compels them to willingly and eagerly give sacrificially of themselves regardless of their circumstances.

When we willingly surrender our hearts 100% to God and His promises, we are able see generosity as an opportunity to sow seeds in God's Kingdom that will produce eternal fruit for others.

1. How does God's grace motivate us to give generously?

2. When called by the scriptures to give sacrificially, have you ever excluded yourself because of your circumstances? How does 2 Corinthians 8 encourage us to be generous even in times of severe affliction and poverty?

3. Why should our generosity come from a willing and eager heart?

4. Since generosity is not a dollar amount, but instead a Christ-like condition of the heart, what are some practical things you can begin doing in your own life to be more generous?

5. What personal attitudes or actions would change if you viewed generosity as a way to make an eternal impact for the Kingdom?

6. The primary goal of this generosity initiative is 100% participation. We want everyone within our church family to go 'All In'. What barriers or excuses is God asking you to lay down so that you can be 'All In' with your generosity?

PRE-COMMITMENT QUESTIONS

Questions to consider before making a financial commitment to 'All In'

- **1.** Read Joshua 24:15. Choose to make your giving to God the type of priority you want it to be. What will that mean for your 'All In' commitment?
- 2. List out the financial commitments that you currently have those that go beyond a one-time payment but that have a time duration to them. Examples would be a home mortgage, a lease agreement, a car loan, a cell phone contract, your child's tuition for school, your own tuition for school, etc.
- **3.** List out the commitment you are planning to make for the 'All In' initiative.
 - **a.** Where does your 'All In' commitment fall in the priority of your other commitments?
 - **b.** Do you need to change or modify one or more of these other commitments in order to be able to fulfill your 'All In' commitment?
 - **c.** Is there a financial commitment you currently have that appears to be prioritized above your ability to make sacrificial giving more of a priority for your household?
 - **d.** If someone who didn't know you looked at your financial commitments, what would they say you value?

WEEK 5 | QUESTIONS FOR REFLECTION A CALL TO 'ALL IN' COMMITMENT

In the final sermon in the 'All In' series, we looked at how making a commitment is the first step of putting our faith into action.

Making a generous commitment is an individual decision guided by faith and joy in God's economic principles of reaping according to what you sow.

Making an 'All In' commitment means trusting that God will provide beyond what you need in order that you may abound in every good work.

1. What is the difference between making a commitment based on faith rather your own strength?

2. Do you believe God's economic principle that you will reap what you sow?

3. How does knowing that God is 'All In' on His mission affect your willingness to be 'All In' as a follower?

4. If you keep this commitment over the next two years, in what way do you expect God to grow you?

HOW WILL YOU RESPOND?

PRAY, READ & FAST

Prayer, Bible study and fasting are some of the ways you can posture yourself to hear from the Lord and discern steps of faith. During this season, the Lord is asking each of us to come before Him with open hearts and pray. Ask the Lord to show you what He wants your generosity to look like. We would also love for you to consider a personal and private fast at some point during the 'All In' initiative.

REFLECT

As you are reading and praying, we believe that the Holy Spirit will be speaking to you. Take time to reflect on what God is saying to you. If you are married, talk together whit your spouse about what you sense the Spirit is leading you toward. If you find yourself in different places, continue to pray and humble yourselves before God and each other until God leads you to a unified decision.

TAKE A STEP OF FAITH

Discipleship and stewardship go hand-in-hand. As we open ourselves up to Jesus, we learn what it means to value Him above all else. Growing as a follower of Jesus is a journey of ongoing steps of trust in Him. We don't grow without taking steps of faith. Growing in stewardship requires us taking a step in trusting Jesus as we give what He has called us to give, because we value Him more than anything.

THE ALL IN JOURNEY

The All In Journey is a tool designed to help a person move from money being their god to money being a tool for God's kingdom. The All In Journey focuses on attitudes of our hearts rather than on amounts or percentages, further transforming us into the likeness of Christ. Each step of the All In Journey is meant to encourage spiritual growth leading to a lifestyle of generosity and sacrifice. These are not steps you climb on a spiritual ladder to get to God, but simply a way to evaluate your personal growth in generosity. Scripture encourages us to grow in every facet of our walk with Christ, including the grace of giving (2 Corinthians 8:7).

First Time Giver

We know it can be a hard decision to give financially to the church for the first time. Giving to the church means that you trust God and the leaders of the church with a financial gift that you could have spent somewhere else. During our "All In" initiative, many will take their first step of faith by making their first gift to the kingdom of God through Solid Rock Church (Matthew 6:19-24).

Consistent Giver

A Consistent Giver is someone who decides to give financial gift to the church on a consistent basis. This is someone who thinks of their giving in the same way they do about other expenses in their budget. This often requires planning and standing firm in your commitment even during hard times. Consistent Givers are on a journey to trust God with 10% (tithe) of their finances (1 Corinthians 16:12; Malachi 3:10).

Sacrificial Giver

A Sacrificial Giver is in a place on their journey where they are asking the questions, "Am I giving in a way that changes me?" "Am I giving in a way that causes my lifestyle to be different to reflect the transformation Christ is making in me?" A sacrificial giver's commitment to giving is driven by faith in the work God is doing and sees that work as the most significant investment they can make. A sacrificial giver has a giving commitment that is "larger than their current situation" so that they must adjust the rest of their expenditures to meet that commitment (Acts 2:42-47, 4:32-37; 2 Samuel 24:24; Proverbs 13:22).

ONE FUND INITIATIVE

WHAT'S A ONE FUND INITIATIVE?

You may have participated in church campaigns in the past in which you were asked to give a second gift 'above and beyond' your usual gifts to make special initiatives like new ministries and new facilities possible. Normally, you gave that above and beyond gift to a 'Building Fund' as you also continued to give to the 'General Fund.' This two-fund approach can be confusing and potentially exclude those who have not yet engaged in giving.

We're taking a one-fund approach. The Solid Rock family is on mission - the mission to extend the glory of God by making disciples through the gospel of Jesus Christ. To reflect that one mission, we will give to one fund.

The All In initiative will last for two years. In those two years, every gift that is given to Solid Rock will go to "All In" to help us cultivate ministry, share the gospel, and make room for more lives to be changed.

We've included a sample commitment card on the next page so you can begin to pray about your step of faith. We're encouraging everyone in our church family to go before the Lord with open hearts as they discern a two-year generosity commitment.

We will provide you with a new commitment card on **Commitment Sunday, March 5, 2017**.

FAQ

If we are committing to All In, how does this change my giving to missions, the general fund, and other special offerings?

During this two-year period, every contribution to God through Solid Rock is a contribution to our All In initiative. Every aspect of the ministry vision God is calling us towards for the next two years will be funded through All In. There will not be separate funds. Every gift made will go into the same fund and will be our All In giving. Therefore, every worship service becomes a time to celebrate and contribute towards what God is doing in us and through us to extend the glory of God by making disciples through the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

What are you asking me to do?

First and foremost, we are asking that you pray and seek God's leading on what He is asking of you. Prepare your heart to hear Him and then listen to what He says. Engage in a community group during this season if you haven't already. Engage in personal reflection with God in the All In booklet. Talk with your spouse, your family, or others about what this commitment will mean for the next season of your life. We are asking that you make a sacrificial commitment to generosity – whatever it is that God leads you to do. Follow His leading. Finally, we ask that you prepare to be amazed. We serve an awesome God! He's moving in huge ways and we anticipate an unprecedented impact from our collective All In commitments - something only God can do. Please mark your calendar for Commitment Sunday, March 5, and prepare to experience a life-changing worship service that will forever be remembered as a defining moment for our church and for you.

Are there additional ways besides cash that I can give more towards 'All In'?

Be creative as you explore ways you and your family can give towards All In. You might have some stocks, property, or other items of that nature. Or you may have some stored resources that God has blessed you with in the past that He might be calling you to give out of during this time. How long is my commitment?

We are asking that everyone make a two-year or 24 month commitment. The fulfillment period for your commitment will begin with our All In contribution on the weekend of March 26, 2017 and it will culminate in March of 2019.

What if I don't have a job right now? What does that mean for my 'All In' commitment?

All In is about your total, radical, sacrificial generosity to God's mission at Solid Rock. Although generosity will look different for every person, we believe God calls us to generosity in times of hardship just as much as He does in times of abundance. All In is about a heart change – one that is only accomplished by surrendering our lives completely to Jesus in the area of giving. That may mean the Lord challenges you to sell things, to pick up odd jobs or even to trust God in faith by making a commitment that you don't quite know how to fulfill right now. Trust God to provide as you seek ways to sacrifice and work towards that commitment. We would like for 100% of those who call Solid Rock home to be a part of All In so that we can all support, love, encourage, and pray for one another through this spiritually-stretching season.

What if I am severely in debt right now? Am I still supposed to give?

If you are currently seeking to make payments to pay off debt right now, we commend you for making progress and you should continue to do so. We would be happy to help you in this journey and/or to recommend financial coaching that might minister to you. Being in debt does not, however, excuse a person from giving. Giving isn't about what God wants *from* you; rather, it's about what God wants *for* you. Like everyone else in our church family, we would encourage you to seek the Lord for direction and then follow through in obedience to Him. What if I have never even given to Solid Rock before?

All In was crafted specifically with you in mind. All In is a "one fund" generosity initiative, meaning that it is different from a traditional capital campaign where you are called to give an extra gift above and beyond your normal giving - thus creating TWO STEPS for people who aren't yet giving. All In is a call to sacrificial and cheerful generosity for everyone at Solid Rock. If you have never given before, this is your chance to get in the game with a committed sacrifice.

What if I am new here?

All In is about the vision for our church. We believe that the local church is one of the most compelling missions to give towards, and we would love for you to make Solid Rock your home and join us to go All In.
